

Moving on from Wizzybug

This guide is for carers who might be considering the next powered mobility stage for their child after the return of Wizzybug. Please note that this guide is for information only and does not recommend any specific future powered mobility devices.

You will need to agree on the next stage with your own local occupational therapist or physiotherapist. Your local wheelchair services will be able to either provide a powered wheelchair for your child or give you a voucher or payment towards your own choice if he/she meets their criteria.
